
3) TEAM/OFFICE

6) SAFETY & SECURITY

- a) OBIAA has released a letter to the Provincial Government to End Homelessness in Ontario. This is included in your package.
- b) A similar letter will be released via email to our membership encouraging people to send to our MP/MPP's

7) BEAUTIFICATION

- a) I will be meeting with the City regarding plans for garbage management this summer on March 20th. I will be presenting a plan for garbage management improvement.
- b) Big Belly's have arrived! We will have 8 installed in the downtown core for summer, which will make a huge difference in garbage management. For those not familiar with this project, click to read more about Big Bellys.

8) PARTNERS

- a) We continue to work with Tourism Kingston and The City of Kingston Public Works and Rec & Leisure staff on public spaces in the downtown core. The Community Spaces Committee participated in a meeting where preliminary plans from the urban planning company were shared and discussed. Highlights below:
 - i) Focused on Springer Market Square
 - ii) potential budget: up to \$300K year 1; \$500K-\$1M total years 2-3
 - iii) draft report with all concepts by March 24 target presentation April 3 to review and
 - iv) heritage committee presentation in April

9) SPECIAL PROJECTS

Waawaateg: Opening ceremonies for this event were very successful, with an estimated 350-400 in attendance for what turned out to be a chilly evening. We heard from several members of the Indigenous community afterwards, thanking us for Visits to the site this weekend both day and evening saw many families and children interacting with the installations.

Here is a thank you from one of the artists that sums it up:

Good morning marijo. I hope you are well rested. I just wanted to say a huge thank you for all your hard work ... it was truly an amazing feeling last night to be able to share our work, bring communities together and most importantly being extremely proud of who we are and where we come from... from our community and others everyone was raised to another level of understanding and togetherness. This was one of the cities biggest positive reconciliation moments... every one left lifted... 🛭 thank you... it really was an amazing event.

I feel this project was a big win for the organization and for the city on a much bigger scale than we can imagine. When people thank me, I am quick to remind them that it was not me. It was a lot of people working together and trusting the process 2 Thank you to each of you for supporting this project as a Board. Be sure to take time to visit the installation. It's there until March 31st.

Sydenham St summer activation: No confirmed updates, but the project will be a focus for the next month while we develop a plan to bring to the board.

168 Wellington St.: We have received 2 artist submissions. CaraCo will be reviewing at their next Board meeting. The next stage is to secure funding.
