EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

While each department work on priority projects we also are all contributing to long-term planning for the year.

PLANNING FOR 2022

We had our first planning session for 2022 events this past week, beginning with Summer in the City (working name for LKM 3.0). We have a second planning session scheduled next week where we will layout a skeleton schedule, which will be presented at our first Member Roundtable in early February. We will present the concept for the summer season to the board in February.

FINANCES

Each department will have completed detailed department budgets by the end of the month which will allow us to forecast and track our spending much more easily in a master budget spreadsheet. We have applied for a My Main Street Grant for an 18 pod Bike Locking station for the parking lot at Ontario and Brock, scheduled for install this coming spring if we secure the grant. This is a pilot project, but if all goes well, we will work with our partners to continue to install more throughout the downtown core.

Reconnect Grant was just released. We will be applying for funding for Summer in the City Programming.

REBRAND AND WEBSITE

We have completed the surveying of community for the rebrand and have been presented with a positioning statement and direction. I am hoping to be able to share something with you at February's meeting.

THE VULNERABLE IN OUR COMMUNITY

I continue to engage in The Downtown Improvement Working Group hosted by Lanie Hurdle and the Homelessness Collective Impact Committee hosted by United Way and Public Health. Both groups are working on medium to long term solutions to address some of the struggles that our community experiences with individuals struggling with homelessness, mental health or addictions challenges.

I will be hosting a Roundtable for our members on Wednesday, February 2nd at 6pm called Vulnerable People in the Downtown Core. A few members of the social services community as well as City representatives will be presenting short synopsis of their work on this topic and will be available for questions. STREET CREW 2022

I am happy to share with you that our pilot program, which involved hiring individuals that were struggling with homelessness to work for the BIA as street crew, has been very successful. We will be offering all 3 individuals parttime contract work until August of this year, funded fully by the City of Kingston. I hope to feature Suzzie, Lennie and Roger in an upcoming blog so that our members can meet them.

COMMITTEES AND WORKING GROUPS

The schedule of meetings for committees and working groups is complete. Invitations will hopefully be out by the Board meeting.

We are requesting quotes on the completion of Policies and Procedures for the organization. We realize that it is a large commitment of time and energy and feel a contractor would have a better chance of completing the project in a timely manner than a committee. Once they are complete, they will go to the committee for review and then onto the board for final approval. I am hoping to have this project complete by summer.

EQUITY, DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

I will be reengaging KEYS, OTEC and LGBT+ Chamber of Commerce on EDI policies, certifications and betterment overall for the downtown community. Once I have something solid to share, I will bring it to the board for review.
