- 1) COUNCIL/ CITY OF KINGSTON COMMITTEES
- ^{1.} The second edition of the <u>Integrated Destination Strategy</u>, led by Tourism Kingston was approved by Council, Wednesday, September 7. I was on the steering committee and part of a group of consulting organizations for the project. This document has set the roadmap for several tourism-related projects, some of which involve or affect downtown Kingston. There is an agenda item marked to discuss pedestrian only opportunities for next year.
- 2. Tannery Project Proposal was voted down on September 9th at the City of Kingston council meeting.

 - a) We are still without a Financial Analyst at the City, so as a result we have moved A/P and Receivables into QuickBooks so that we can keep track internally. I would like to explore other options for bookkeeping. There is an agenda item under Financials to discuss options.
- 8) SAFETY & SECURITY
 - a) This fall we will do an audit of all security cameras in downtown Kingston and map them out. This will be followed by an education campaign on the importance of investing in security cameras in an urban centre our size.
 - b) I will be doing research on the use of public cameras in downtown cores in Ontario so that we can have a more fulsome discussion in October's meeting.
 - c) Mounted Officer: I have been working with the City to secure the last bit of funding we need to ensure that the Mounted Police officer remains an accessible enforcement tool in the downtown core. <u>Click to read more</u> about Murney and why it is important to continue to advocate for the program.
- 9) **BEAUTIFICATION**
 - a) I have extended the Home Base Housing Street Crew contract until December, with some financial assistance from the City.
